OSHA Construction Industry Standards Training

Course 1: July 7-10, 2025 - Construction Industry Standards (OSHA 510)

Course 2: July 14-17, 2025 - Construction Train-the-Trainer (OSHA 500)

Trainers: WVU OSHA Certified Faculty

Location: Virtual

Description: The OSHA 510 and OSHA 500 courses are designed for Virginia trade and industrial education carpentry, cabinetmaking, electricity, building trades, masonry, plumbing, and other related CTE instructors who require initial OSHA certification or recertification. To participate in the OSHA 500 course, instructors must provide proof of completion for the prerequisite OSHA 510 course and have five years of construction safety experience.

Completion of the OSHA 500 authorizes the trainer to conduct 10- and 30-hour construction courses in accordance with OSHA Outreach Training Program requirements for four years.

Participants will be provided digital copies of the OSHA 500 instructional materials and over 80 PowerPoint presentations on the OSHA construction standards.

OSHA Update for Construction Industry Training

Course 3: July 7-9, 2025 - Update for Construction Industry Outreach Trainers (OSHA 502)

Trainers: WVU OSHA Certified Faculty

Location: Virtual

Description: The OSHA 502 course, Update for Construction Industry Outreach Trainers, is intended for current construction instructors that have earned the OSHA 500 certification in the last four years. These individuals are not required to attend the OSHA 510 if they have a current 500 authorization, provided the expiration does not exceed four years from the training start date.

OSHA Scaffolding Awareness Course Training

Course 4: July 24, 2025 - OSHA Scaffolding Awareness Course

Trainers: WVU OSHA Certified Faculty

Location: Sheraton Norfolk Waterside Hotel, 777 Waterside Drive, Norfolk, Virginia

Description: This course is intended to teach end users safe work practices with scaffolding, hazard recognition, and abatement. Participants will receive materials, manuals, and certificates, and are responsible for all travel-related expenses and technology-related hardware to include a computer that is able to access the Internet. Travel-related expenses are an allowable Perkins expenditure if included in the school division's approved Perkins Local Plan. This course is provided as part of the VATIE Professional Development Conference and also requires conference registration.
